I've been riding a 1970 Triumph Tiger named Roxanne, and a 1967 BSA Lightning named Kelly. Both are very nice, but not absolutely pristine.

Vendors

For the past 18 months, I have been restoring a 1972 Combat Commando that I bought from Lauretta Atkinson's "collection." It had once been in the stable of her late husband and my good friend, **Steve Atkinson**, a dyslexic mechanic if there ever was one,

and a co-founder of DVNR. I won't labor you with the ordinary decisions of my project so far; you'll see this Handsome Angel ride up soon enough. But I did want to "share" with you two interesting vendors I've encountered.



First is Chris Wyckoff of Hawthorne, NJ. He was raised in his father's Norton dealership in Wayne, NJ, and he knows his Nortons. He has a motorcycle collection of his own now that includes one (cross yourself when you say this name) MV Augusta. (And he rides dangerously fast, if you ask me.) Chris' business is called "The Shining", and his profession is polishing aluminum pieces so smooth that they are easily mistaken for chrome. It was not my intention to faux chrome the whole Handsome Angel; I was just looking for someone to clean up my ugly lower fork legs. There were painful looking road gouges in both, typical of Atkinson's ordinarily-upright riding style. Couldn't

"I ran across a 1970 Commando "S" model, but with Roadster pipes – running, but needing work -- for cheap. So I bought it; it's actually in my wife's name because she always wanted me to get one! It smokes badly. So it's getting a rebuild. (Thank you John The engine work should be **Brownell** for the lead.) finished sometime in January, after which I'll begin the other work, starting with painting the frame, rebuilding the front-end, rewiring the electrics, etc. I have a favorite setup that eliminates most connectors and adds extra fuses to separate the ignition from everything else. I'll probably keep the points, but use a Typanium rectifier. The Amals have what look like new jets already and the slides are OK, so I'll probably keep them too. The wheels are OK, but the exhaust, fenders and seat need replacing.

"Hopefully, I'll finish all the mechanicals by May, so I can prep and paint the tank and side covers when it gets warmer outside. With any luck, I'll have it on the road by summer."

bring myself to put them on the bike. A local auto body shop turned me on to Chris, and when he gave me the legs back, they were clean as a whistle. Sold me. At this point, there's nothing left on my bike for him to do. If it's aluminum, he already polished it. Instrument housings, Z plates, covers, levers, you name it. Wasn't cheap but it looks nice. Second, there's a fellow in Caseyville, Illinois, named Gary Hollowich. His business is called Disk Brake Reconditioners. Name's pretty self-explanatory. The front disk that came with my bike was probably already old when the poor thing was put out to Mother Nature's corrosive pasture 6 years ago following Steve's death. It was borderline garbage. And the garbage is exactly where it was headed until Chris Greenbacker, Norton Wizard Extraordinaire, referred me to Gary Hollowich. He does just what the name says, and your disk comes back looking just like new. As I recall, he offers three basic options: 1) Plain reconditioned surface; 2) Plain disk surface and nickel-plated center; and 3) All chrome. I picked option 2 for \$60. 
