Mike Harrod. INOA member from Tennessee, explains the difference between the P11 and 15CS as follows: "This bike shares only the motor, tranny, tank, gages, and handle bars. The P11 frame is a G80 Matchless, the brake hubs are smaller, forks are scramblers type, seat smaller, and so on. This is a mistake that many people make that don't know these hybrids. There were three types of these bikes that were essentially the same except for the tank badges: the Norton like mine, the Matchless and the AJS 33. At Ohio the other bike that was in the Hybrid class was a P11. The color of the bikes are the same - Candy Apple Red with the silver stripes which is why people mistake them for the same."

Mysterious Fuel Additive Revealed

The conversation turned to fuel additives during the Wellsboro rally in June. Nick Lutwyche provides the following information on a product developed in the UK.

"Visit FUEL CAT at their web page http://www.fuelcat.co.uk/mainpage.html. Lots of information at this site. I use it in my Commando, which with a Norvil 920cc overbore, ported cylinder head, twin Amal 932s and a Combat SS camshaft, runs happily on Regular grade fuel. I used a Fuel Cat in my son's Citroen 2CV which was only supposed to run on leaded 93 octane and it was still running happily 3 years later after a continuous diet of 87 Octane unleaded. I also installed a Fuel Cat in my Citroen turbo diesel hatchback, in the UK in the early 90's. In the UK, every vehicle whether petrol or diesel, has to have an annual emissions test. There is a public hotline to report any smoky diesel powered vehicle. At the second annual emissions check on the Citroen diesel, the local garage doing the testing called the service dept. for his emissions test equipment. The Fuel Cat had lowered the diesel engine

emissions to figures so low that he could not believe them, but after several retests with consistent results he had to accept them. Over time, the use of a Fuel Cat will lead to your engine oil staying cleaner for longer, and existing carbon deposits in the engine will be reduced."
